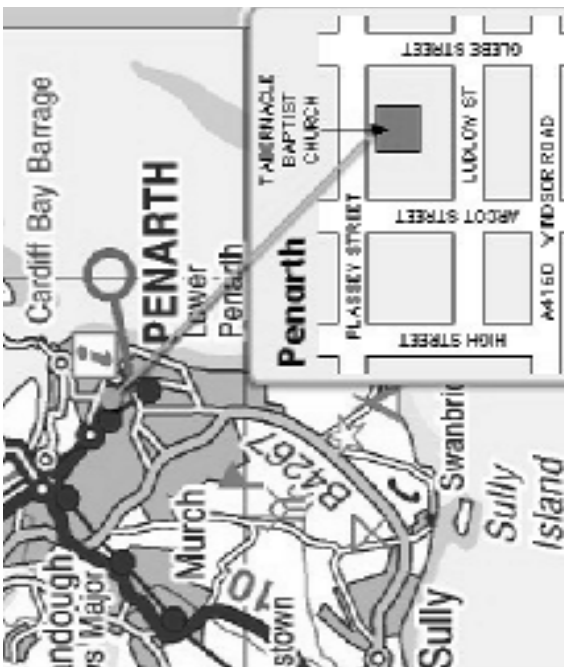

Signs, Wonders & Church Growth

Designed to follow on from the Healing Ministry Course (2003), this Tabernacle Course will run on a Tuesday evening for 5 consecutive weeks during June 2004. Attendance at the first course is **not** a requirement for attendance.

The course will examine the link between the charismatic gifts and the Great Commission, exploring the theme that 'signs and wonders' are primarily evangelistic in function.

The course fee is £10.00 payable at registration on the first session attended. However, sponsorships are available for the unwaged or those on low incomes. If paying the fee is problematic, please contact the course tutor, Revd. Roger Grafton.

No previous experience or knowledge is required for this course. This is a 'stand-alone' course, so previous units are not a requirement of enrolment

All evenings begin at **7.30 pm** and will conclude by **9.30 pm** with a short refreshment break part way through the evening

Course Outline & description

1st June - Introduction & assumptions

An introduction to the course, including an overview of the gifts of the Spirit and the theme of 'signs and wonders.' This session will ask, "what is the Gospel?" and "What is 'good news for the poor'?" How does the Nazareth manifesto (Luke 4:18-19) link Christ's preaching ministry with his demonstration of the coming of the Kingdom?

8th June - Programme versus power

For the most part of its history the Church has used evangelistic programmes to reach the lost. This session will examine some of those programmes and compare their strengths and weaknesses, particularly in a post- modern culture.

15th June - Power & paradigm

The Western Church is set in a culture where the primary worldview is rationalistic and scientific. However, the worldview of the Bible and the 1st century was very different. This session will explore the themes of cultural blind spots and 'learning to see' our modern world through a supernatural paradigm.

22nd June - Models of ministry

How did Jesus do evangelism? How did the early Church change the world it lived in? How can we learn from them as we reach out to the lost in South Wales and beyond?

29th June - Putting ministry into practice

A guide to good practice in ministry, an understanding of the appropriate use of 'power' and 'authority', and an introduction to team ministry in an evangelistic setting.
